

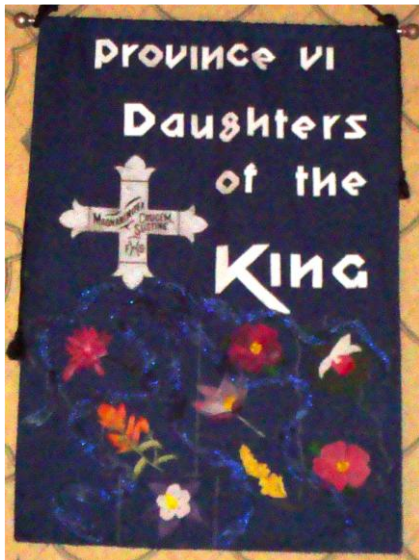


STREAMS OF LIVING WATER



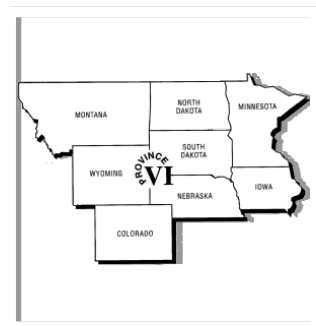

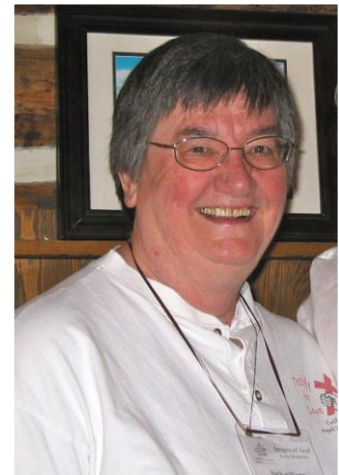
AMY MAYES
